Dear Parents,

Classes for September 2019

We will soon be thinking ahead to September, deciding where teachers will be placed and which classes they will be teaching. Each year we consider carefully whether we keep classes as they are or whether we mix children up into new classes; last year we mixed up all classes but the year before we only did this for the year 5s as they moved into year 6.

For September 2019 we very much feel that classes are not as balanced as we would like them to be, nor as we had hoped they would be. By balance I mean a sensible mixture of pupils based upon gender, term of birth, academic attainment, Special Educational Needs, behaviour and attitudes to learning.

Therefore, to ensure that all children have the best chance of success in their next year group, we are going to re-group the children based upon a more even spread of the factors mentioned above. We will, of course, consider who children are good 'working friends' with, so that they know they will be in the classroom with someone they like and work well with. *Please note, we will NOT be asking the children who they want to be with.*

IMPORTANT

We know there are some children who, for whatever reason, are best placed away from certain other children. These reasons have undoubtedly been discussed with parents previously and will obviously be factored in to our groupings but please may I ask that those parents contact me, either via the school email (driffield.juniors@eastriding.gov.uk) or by letter, with a written reminder of who their child is best separated from and why (briefly). This way we will have a better chance of getting the classes as well balanced as we can. Obviously we cannot 100% guarantee avoiding certain children being placed in the same class together, but we will do our very best.

Your child will spend the day in their new classroom with their new teacher on Thursday 4th July, which is the same day as our year 6s will have their transition day visit to Driffield School.

That same evening straight after school until 4.15pm is the opportunity for you, if you wish to, to meet your child on the playground, pop and see which classroom he/she will be in and say hello to the teacher. That way you are able to put a face to a name!
