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Dear Parents/Carers

Since the changed legislation regarding holidays in term time was announced, there has been a great deal of debate regarding 'exceptional circumstances'.

At a previous meeting of the Driffield and Wolds Partnership of Headteachers the issue of attendance at Driffield Show was discussed. When this was initially looked at in September 2013, heads were advised by the Local Authority that attendance at Driffield Show did not meet the criteria for exceptional circumstances so attendance could not be authorised. This year's show is within the normal school year and it has been agreed that as this is part of the local promotion of Modern British Values an exception can be made and for this year attendance can be authorised.

We ask that all parents/carers complete the slip below, indicating whether you wish to apply for an authorised absence, or whether your child will be in school all day, by ticking the appropriate box. Please return the slip to school no later than **Wednesday 10th July 2019.**

Each application will be considered by the Headteacher on its individual merits and may depend on other absences from school. Please note that if you have not requested absence for your child on this day and your child is consequently absent to attend Driffield Show the Headteacher (by law) cannot retrospectively authorise the absence.

School will remain open to all students on Wednesday 17th July 2019 as normal.

Please note that this only covers Driffield show (not The Great Yorkshire show etc) and will be reviewed on a year by year basis. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to contact me.

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Dear Parents/Carers,

I am writing with regard to the children's handicraft entries at this year's Driffield Show. I am sending this letter early in order to give the children time to think about which section they would like to enter (see overleaf for entry categories).

This year Driffield Show is giving free entry to the show to all pupils in our school regardless of whether they submit entries. As a community school, we would still like as many children as possible to enter exhibits into the show. If your child wishes to enter exhibits via school please follow these instructions.

Children must have registered their entry/entries by Monday 1st July with the school office in an envelope which clearly states the child's name, class, entry category and a 25p entry fee for each exhibit.

In the past, it has been lovely to see a great number of children entering categories and we want this year to be no different. As in previous years, we will provide backing paper to mount 2D entries, but ask that parents mount their own child's work at home (2cm) border, as the sheer number of entries make this very difficult to manage.

Each entry must be in the handicraft tent by 9.15am at the latest on the morning of the show. Entries can be taken to the showground from 6.00am on show day, or between 7.00am and 6.45pm the day before. Please note that if it rains on the Tuesday night, there may be some 'wilting' of the paper entries and anything glued). If you are unable to take your child's entry/entries to the show, we are able to arrange for a few 2D items to be collected from school. If you wish us to do this, the entry/entries must be in school by Thursday 11th July (please note we do not accept responsibility for items lost or damaged in transit).

If your child wishes to enter a vegetable animal, boiled egg, miniature garden or cookery item, then these must be taken to the show on the morning of the show by yourselves (recipes for cookery can be obtained from your child's class teacher).

If you would like your child's entry back it can be collected from the showground after the show between 5.00pm and 6.00pm.

Thank you for encouraging your child to take part in the handicraft competitions. It is an integral part of the show and the children's exhibits from our school form a great part of the total exhibition.
