I am writing to express my concerns about the impact deforestation has on the Earth. Hundreds of years ago, rainforests covered up to 60% of the Earth's surface. Now, in 2019, rainforests cover only 10%. The causes of deforestation are agriculture, logging, palm oil and land.

Every minute, forests the size of 20 football fields are cut down. If we were to carry on at this rate, there would be no rainforest left in 100 years. 4 square miles of rainforest contain up to 1500 species of flowering plants, 400 species of bird, 750 types of trees and 150 species of butterflies. Therefore, some animals become extinct before they are even discovered. Some species are threatened by slash and burn farming methods. Humans cut trees down then set them on fire, destroying many creatures homes. Trees are used by animals for shelter from heavy rain as well as supplying them with food. Furthermore, it helps regulate the temperature.

As the global demand for meat increases, many cattle farms have grown larger in order to feed the world. There are a multitude of reasons for farming: palm oil, meat and mining.
